**Subject:** Confirmation of Avian Influenza in Murshidabad District of West Bengal.

Sir,

In continuation of this Department's letter of even number dated 14<sup>th</sup> January, 2009, I am directed to inform that the sample collected from the following area have tested positive for H5 strain of Avian Influenza in the rapid tests conducted at the High Security Animal Disease Laboratory (HSADL), Bhopal:

2. Consequent upon occurrence of Avian Influenza, the Government of West Bengal needs to take a series of strategic actions immediately. Such actions are to be taken both by the Animal Resources Development Department and the Public Health Department of the State. The strategy has been detailed in the document 'Action Plan of Animal Husbandry for Preparedness, Control and Containment of Avian Influenza', revised and circulated by the Government of India in November, 2006 and other instructions/guidelines issued by the Government of India from time to time. In this connection, the 'Contingency Plan' circulated by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India may also be referred to.

3. It is requested that necessary actions as contained in the Action Plan referred to above (especially in Part III thereof) may please be initiated immediately. These include declaration of infected and surveillance areas, ban on movement of poultry and its products in infected area, closure of poultry and egg markets within a radius of 10 kms. from the infected site, ban on movement of farm personnel, restricting access to infected premises, destruction and disposal of birds, disposal of infected material, clean-up and disinfection followed by sealing of the premises and issue of sanitization certificate, post operations surveillance, imposition of legislative measures etc. along with necessary measures laid down in the Contingency Plan of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India.

4. It has been decided that all poultry within a radius of 3 kms. of the focus of infection as given below will be culled:-

(a) **Murshidabad District:**

| S.No. | Villages                 | Block    |
|-------|--------------------------|----------|
| 1.    | Haripur Uttarpara, Ninur | Khargram |
| 2.    | Badua, Kharjuna, Simulia | Burwan   |

In addition to the culling strategy mentioned above, surveillance will be carried out over a further radius up to 10 kilometers.

5. It is the policy of the Government to compensate for loss of poultry on account of culling and destruction of birds. The rate for payment of compensation has also been indicated to the State Governments. The Government of India shares 50% of the cost of compensation for which funds already made available to the Government of West Bengal for implementation of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme 'Assistance to States for Control of Animal Disease' (ASCAD), may be utilized. It may please be ensured that payment of compensation is made upfront at the time of culling of birds and destruction of eggs and feed materials.

6. A daily report on the control and containment operations may please be furnished to this Department by 11.00 A.M.

7. International Organizations will be notified by the Government of India at its level.

8. Surveillance throughout the State may be intensified to monitor further spread of infection, if any.
